Managing Country Together

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Contingency Plan for Licenced Tour Operators in Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park and Mount Arapiles – Tooan State Park.

The Grampians (Gariwerd) National Park and Mount Arapiles – Tooan State Park are internationally renowned recreation destinations. In particular, world class rock climbing and bush walking opportunities attract a significant number of visitors who engage Licensed Tour Operators (LTOs) to undertake these activities.

To protect significant Aboriginal Cultural Heritage and values in the two parks LTOs authorised to undertake recreation activities must adhere to the following Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Contingency Plan outlined below.

The following steps are to be followed if suspected Aboriginal Ancestral remains are found.

1. Discovery:

- If suspected Ancestral human remains are discovered, STOP ACTIVITIES IMMEDIATELY.
- Leave the suspected remains in place, and protected from any harm or damage. It is of great importance that Aboriginal Ancestral remains are not disturbed from their burial place.
- DO NOT take any photography or video of the remains, unless instructed to do so by Parks
 Victoria's Managing Country Together staff, the Ancestral Remains Unit at the Victorian
 Aboriginal Heritage Council or the Coroner's Office.
- DO NOT contact the media.

2. Notification:

- You must **IMMEDIATELY** notify the relevant the Area Chief Ranger who will contact the appropriate Aboriginal Cultural Protection Heritage specialists.
- If the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Protection Specialist believe there is a chance that they are
 Ancestral Remains, they will immediately contact the Ancestral Remains Unit (ARU), Victoria
 Police on 000 or the State Coroner's office (Via the Victorian Institute of Forensic Medicine
 1300 309 519). It is a legal requirement that the Coroner is responsible for the identification
 of human remains and determines if the remains are Aboriginal Ancestral remains.

3. Protection:

- The person in charge of the activity (LTO) must ensure that activities at the location of the
 discovery are suspended and an appropriate buffer established around the Aboriginal heritage
 place or site and/or object. If necessary isolate by safety webbing, flagging tape or another
 suitable barrier, usually with a 10-meter radius around the extent.
- All workers (climbing guides and group members) must be made aware of the discovery to avoid accidental disturbance.

4. Recommencement of Activities

 The ARU, in consultation with the relevant Registered Aboriginal Party or Traditional Owner group, will determine the appropriate course of action as required by S.18(2)(b) of the Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006. Activities are not to recommence until these requirements have been met.

To be followed if any other Aboriginal Cultural Heritage is uncovered during activities.

1. Discovery:

• If suspected Aboriginal Cultural Heritage is discovered, **STOP ACTIVITIES**, leave the heritage in place, and protected from any harm or damage.

2. Notification:

 Immediately notify the person in charge of the activity (LTO), the relevant Area Chief Ranger and Regional Aboriginal Heritage Coordinator or Aboriginal Heritage Operations Coordinator (who will notify Aboriginal Victoria).

3. Protection:

- The person in charge of the activity must ensure that activities at the location of the discovery are suspended and an appropriate buffer established around the Aboriginal heritage place or site and/or object. If necessary isolate by safety webbing, flagging tape or another suitable barrier, usually with a 10-meter radius around the extent.
- All workers (climbing guides and group members) must be made aware of the buffer zone.
- No activities are to continue within the buffer area at this point.
- Activities outside the area of exclusion may recommence if permission is given to do so by Parks Victoria.

4. Recommencement of Works

The Area Chief Ranger, Aboriginal Heritage Coordinator, and Registered Aboriginal Party or Traditional Owner organisations will collaborate and agree on the appropriate actions, including:

- Approvals and/or authorisations (Cultural Heritage Management Plan/ Cultural Heritage Permit).
- Update/ and or completion of relevant Aboriginal cultural heritage records for submission to Aboriginal Victoria.
